Understanding Service Life: When Is Your Refrigerator Still Worth Repairing?

Most refrigerators deliver solid performance for 10 to 15 years under normal use. If your unit is in years 1 through 8, a service call and repair is almost always the right move—you're protecting an appliance with most of its service life ahead. Professionals and homeowners alike use a straightforward benchmark: if a repair costs more than 50 percent of a replacement appliance, and your refrigerator is already past the midpoint of its service life, replacement is usually smarter. A new refrigerator costs \$800 to \$2000 depending on features. If your 13-year-old refrigerator needs a \$500 repair, and you're already 2 years beyond the average end-of-life threshold, you're at the decision boundary. At that point, a \$150 service call is no longer a one-off expense—it's the start of a series.
