- Try to find cases where the "flooring" worth isn't disastrously low.
- Avoid battles consisting entirely of costly, unpredictable souvenir plans unless prepared to lose the investment instantly.

4. Use Free Daily Bonuses and Rakeback

Most reliable case field of honor provide daily rewards, deposit bonuses, or rakeback (a portion of the home edge went back to the player). Using these advantages efficiently extends playtime without needing extra deposits from an individual checking account.

Dos and Do n'ts of Case Battles

- **DON'T** play while emotionally disappointed or tired.
