- The "Covert" rarity is the rarest tier and constantly appears as the benefit item (knife or gloves).
- The percentages shown are approximate and can shift somewhat with each case spot.
- Prices on the Steam Market often go beyond the in-game cost for highly sought-after skins.

3.1 Economy Influence

When a brand-new case launches, the marketplace reacts within hours. The **Recoil Case**, for instance, drove the rate of the *SCAR-20|Plan* (Mil-Spec) from £ 0.15 to £ 0.45 on the first day. On the other hand, older cases like **Prisma** often see a rate dip as supply stabilises.

3.2 Aesthetic Variety

Valve's current modifications have actually partially increased the **Covert** drop rate (from 0.20% to 0.25%). While this may seem minimal, it makes opening a case a little more fulfilling for those chasing after a knife or gloves.
