Frequently the most pricey version of a skin. **Very Little Wear (MW)** 0.07-- 0.15 Minor acnes or small scratches, normally just visible upon close inspection. **Field-Tested (FT)** 0.15-- 0.38 Moderate wear. Scratches and paint breaking ended up being plainly visible on the body and barrel. **Well-Worn (WW)** 0.38-- 0.45 Considerable wear. Significant parts of the paint are faded, and heavy scratches are popular. **Battle-Scarred (BS)** 0.45-- 1.00 Incredibly worn. The weapon typically looks heavily rusted, unclean, or nearly entirely stripped of paint. *(Note: Some skins look distinctively cool in this condition, making the label "Blackimov").*
