Classifications of Rarity

To understand the community completely, collectors divide unusual products into distinct categories based on their origin and distinct characteristics.

1 Contraband and Discontinued Items

Valve is generally hands-off with the economy, however exceptions exist. The **M4A4|Howl** is the sole item categorized as "Contraband." Following a copyright disagreement over the original artwork, Valve modified the design and removed the case drop system entirely. Anybody holding a Howl kept it, creating a completely topped supply.

Similarly, older operation cases (like the Bravo Case or Huntman Case) no longer drop natively in-game, meaning each time one is opened, the total worldwide supply completely reduces.

2. The "Blue Gem" Phenomenon

The *Case Hardened* finish is one of the most intricate skin enters Counter-Strike history. It uses a gradient map of blue, purple, and gold that shifts depending upon the weapon's pattern index.

- **The Anomaly:** While a lot of Case Hardened skins feature a mottled mix of colors, exceptionally rare pattern variations cover almost 100% of the weapon's surface in solid blue.
- **The Pricing:** These "Blue Gems"-- especially on the Karambit and the AK-47-- command costs that overshadow factory-new knives of greater tier types.

3. Memento Packages from Major Championships

During Valve-sponsored Major competitions, audiences seeing via Steam or linked platforms might arbitrarily get Souvenir Packages dropped during specific matches.

- These packages come pre-applied with gold tournament sticker labels celebrating the groups and the MVP of the round.
- The most famous among them are the **Cobblestone Souvenir Packages** signed by famous players like Kenny "kennyS" Schrub, consisting of the coveted AWP|Dragon Lore.

Drift value is a mathematical value in between 0.00 and 1.00 that identifies the wear condition of a skin. <https://cs2skin.com/cases>

- **Factory New:** 0.00-- 0.07
- **Very little Wear:** 0.07-- 0.15
- **Field-Tested:** 0.15-- 0.38
- **Well-Worn:** 0.38-- 0.45
- **Battle-Scarred:** 0.45-- 1.00. Particular skins are "float capped," suggesting they can not physically drop in Factory New condition, making lower-float Minimal Wear versions remarkably important.
