Continue packing room by room and label each box clearly. Confirm arrangements with the moving company and make sure the crew knows about stairs, elevators, parking limitations, specialty items, and other important details.

One Week Before Moving

Finish most packing and prepare a separate essentials bag. Confirm the moving schedule, organize keys, protect important documents, and make sure pathways are clear for the movers.

Moving Day

Keep important personal belongings with you whenever practical. Walk through the home before the movers leave and check closets, cabinets, garages, attics, and storage areas to make sure nothing has been forgotten.
