Planning for a generous scribe and a taller backsplash spared us from a visual gap at the back of the quantity.

Confirm overhangs, thickness, and complete heights

Overhang decisions force equally aesthetics and purpose. Standard overhang on the entrance edge of kitchen counter tops stages from 1 to at least one.5 inches past the cupboard face. If you may have inset doors, measure from the body, now not the doors. On exposed finish panels and at dishwasher panels, confirm you'll have the comparable overhang, no longer a random deeper lip. Overhangs near doors or tight walkways infrequently desire to decrease to avoid a hip-snagging part.

Material thickness interacts with executed peak. Edge profiles, seams, and grain direction
