

Losing your phone is always a stressful experience, but if you use apps like **Bingo Plus** for fun or banking, you need to act fast to protect your personal data, finances, and privacy. In this comprehensive guide, I'll walk you through the exact steps you should take — from using remote lock features to managing app permissions — to keep yourself safe and minimize damage.

Many people download apps like Bingo Plus from questionable sources, or fail to check domains carefully. Others overlook privacy settings or assume their phones are automatically secure. Step 1: Verify the Source of Your Bingo Plus App

- **For Android:** Only download from the official *Google Play Store*. - Change your email password to something strong and unique.
- Enable two-factor authentication (2FA) for added security.

These actions help prevent someone else from grabbing your Bingo Plus or other app credentials by intercepting email recovery messages.

1. Open the **Settings** app.

If your phone is lost now, these steps help prep in the future — and after you recover or replace your device, do this immediately.

Step 5: Adjust Notification Settings to Protect Your Privacy

One subtle risk when your phone is lost is someone seeing private information dgmnews.com on your lock screen via notifications from Bingo Plus or other apps.

Before a loss happens,* you should tweak notification settings:

- **Android:** Go to *Settings > Apps & Notifications > Notifications*, then select *Bingo Plus*. Disable lock screen previews or set notifications to “No visual interruptions.”
- **iOS/iPadOS:** Open *Settings > Notifications > Bingo Plus*, then disable *Show on Lock Screen*.
