

An overhead garage door is one of the largest moving systems in a Los Angeles home. It secures vehicles, storage, and entry points while operating several times each week. Because the door contains springs, cables, rollers, tracks, panels, sensors, and an opener, a small defect can soon develop into a safety or access problem.

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Professional garage door repair should determine the failed component before recommending a replacement.
