

The very first time I helped a next-door neighbor set up a sprinkler system, we allotted one weekend. We completed on the third, sore, sunburned, and a little humbled. The system worked, although we spent the following month dialing in head placement, fixing little leaks, and discovering why water stress on paper does not constantly match what appears of a trench line after 8 tees and a surge in grade. That experience instructed me a truth I have seen time and again: when it pertains to lawn sprinkler installment, design choices made on the first day echo for several years, in water bills, in plant health, and in just how frequently you discover on your own down in the dirt doing sprinkler repair.
