Advanced players understand that a 6:5 blackjack table is a sucker's bet. They specifically hunt for 3:2 tables, preferably where the dealer stands on a soft 17 (S17) and late surrender is permitted.

4. Making Use Of Table Psychology and Composition-Dependent Strategy
