Pro tip: Always load your dumpster evenly and avoid piling debris higher than the fill line marked on the side. Overfilling causes safety hazards and may result in extra fees or refused pickup.



5. Confirm Access for the Dumpster Truck & Trailer

Even if your placement spot is perfect, the dumpster truck still needs room to maneuver, especially at the rear where trailers are backed and positioned.

Key Access Factors to Consider

- **Width:** At least 14 feet of driveway width is ideal for large dumpsters to back in without tight turns.
- **Length:** Ensure there's enough room behind the property for the truck trailer (usually 50-60 feet required).
- **Obstructions:** Remove parked cars, trash bins, gardening equipment, and trailers that block truck access.
- **Surface condition:** Gravel or uneven spots can cause trucks to get stuck—try to clear a solid concrete or asphalt area for approach and departure.

- "Truck must enter from Elm Street, back down 50 ft driveway."
