- **Lack of Community Presence:** Check platforms like Trustpilot, Reddit (e.g., r/csgobetting), and Twitter. If a website has an extremely unfavorable credibility or is totally unidentified, it is best prevented.

Best Practices for Safe Wagering

Even on the most legitimate platforms, accountable bankroll management and security health are crucial. Follow these suggestions to make sure a safe experience:
