In response, the market adapted. Sites shifted from utilizing Steam accounts directly for automatic trading to using cryptocurrencies (Bitcoin, Ethereum, GBPT) or peer-to-peer trading systems. More recently, Valve executed a 7-day trade hang on freshly traded products, seriously interfering with the immediate liquidity that made skin gambling so popular.
