

Garage Door Repair Near Me in Los Angeles

Failed Springs, Cables, and Rollers

A failed **torsion spring** is mounted above the door, while an **extension spring** is typically positioned along the horizontal tracks. Both types are under significant tension and should only be adjusted or replaced by a qualified professional.
