- Test the zippers and handles *thoroughly*—I always double-zip my bags in-store to avoid flimsy failures later.
- Check the strap length and adjustability—each inch counts for your ease of movement.

Construction Checks You Can Do in Hand

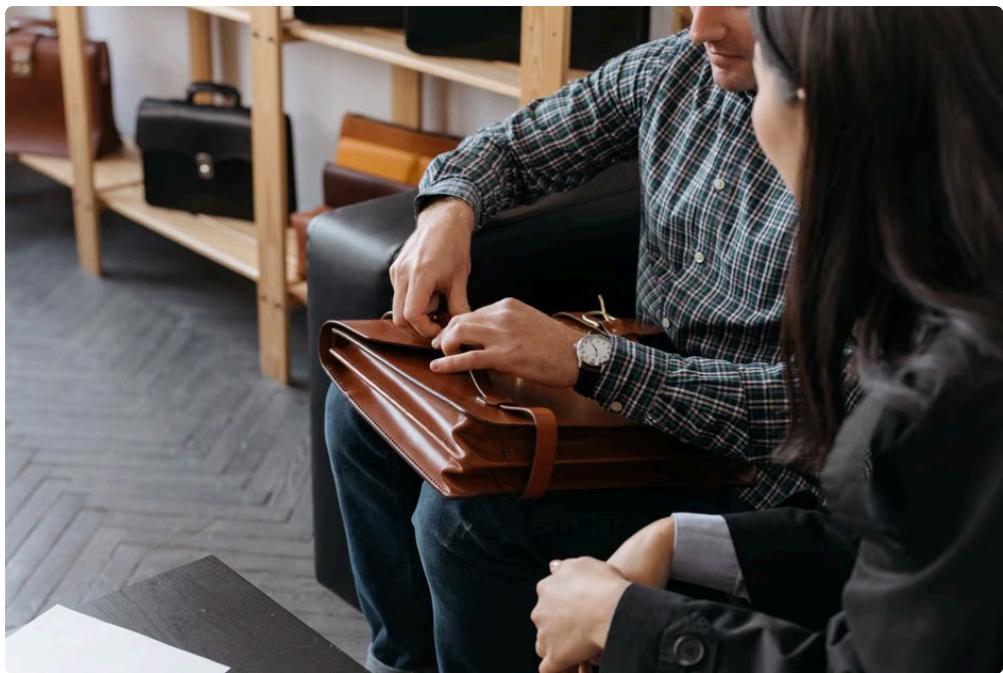
Before handing over your credit card, run these quick checks on the briefcase's build:
