The Five Wear Categories

To help gamers understand the physical condition of a weapon at a look, Valve classified float worths into five unique tiers:



Condition Name	Float Value Range	Visual Description
Factory New (FN)	0.00-- 0.07	Beautiful condition with little to no visible scratches or use.
Minimal Wear (MW)	0.07-- 0.15	Extremely minor imperfections, generally only noticeable upon close inspection.
Field-Tested (FT)	0.15-- 0.38	Obvious wear, scratches, and minor paint chipping on high-friction locations.
Well-Worn (WW)	0.38-- 0.45	Significant wear, fading colors, and popular

scratches. **Battle-Scarred (BS)** 0.45-- 1.00 Heavily distressed, rusted, or scraped away, often giving the weapon a gritty, industrial look.

The CS2 Economy: Rarity Tiers

Skins are classified into various rarity tiers, which dictate their drop rates in-game or acquisition rates by means of weapon cases. Understanding these tiers is essential for anyone wanting to comprehend the market worth of their inventory.

- **Consumer Grade (White):** Common, standard weapon surfaces, typically discovered in weekly gameplay drops.
- **Industrial Grade (Light Blue):** Slightly less typical than consumer grade, however still normally low-value.
- **Mil-Spec (Dark Blue):** The basic baseline for a lot of collection and case skins.
- **Restricted (Purple):** Often forms the middle tier of case drops; visually striking and reasonably priced.
- **Classified (Pink):** High-tier weapons that feature complex art work and command significant market attention.
- **Covert (Red):** The greatest standard weapon tier, including the most desired rifle and SMG surfaces in the video game.
- **Unique Item (Gold/Exotic):** The rarest tier, encompassing knives and representative gloves.

How to Acquire CS2 Skins

Players have numerous opportunities to obtain and expand their digital toolboxes, varying from casual gameplay to active market trading.

- **Weekly Care Packages:** By playing on main servers and leveling up as soon as a week, gamers get a care package allowing them to choose a few free graffiti or weapon drops.
- **Opening Cases:** Players can buy or make weapon cases and utilize a matching secret (bought from the in-game shop) to unlock a random skin. *Keep in mind: This works similarly to a lotto system and relies heavily on opportunity.*
- **The Steam Community Market:** The authorities, controlled community where players purchase and sell skins using Steam Wallet funds.
- **Third-Party Trading Platforms:** Independent marketplaces enable users to purchase and offer skins for real-world fiat currency or cryptocurrency, typically including lower fees and more robust trading tools.

Tips for Trading and Collecting Safely

Since high-tier CS2 skins can command prices comparable to luxury cars or genuine estate, the community is sadly targeted by destructive stars, scammers, and phishers. Anybody participating in the skin economy should follow rigorous safety protocols:
