- **The Reverse Martingale (Paroli):** Players double their bets after a *win* instead of a loss, trying to ride a winning streak while keeping losses decreased to the base bet quantity.
- **The Moonshot Strategy:** Placing little bets with the intent of claiming massive multipliers (50x, 100x, or greater). This functions much like playing the lottery.
