

The drive motor does the actual work—it turns the drum, powers the pump, and creates the mechanical motion that cleans your clothes. Unlike the control board, the motor is a sealed component that can't be repaired in parts; it must be replaced as a whole. At five years, a drive motor failure is still economically repairable because the motor itself is typically \$250–\$450 in parts, plus labor.

However, the drive motor failure tells you something important: mechanical wear is setting in. If the motor has failed at year five, you should have the bearing and seal inspected during the same service call. Simple components are reliable components, which means when a heating element fails at five years, it's usually an isolated thermal failure with no knock-on damage. The drum bearing supports the rotating drum and typically lasts 10–14 years. At five years, bearing failure is less common but not rare, especially in homes with hard water or lint buildup. Here's where component diagnosis becomes the deciding factor: if the bearing is the only failure, repair still pencils out because the bearing replacement typically runs \$400–\$700 in parts and labor. That's still cheaper than a new washer.



However, if bearing failure is accompanied by drum damage, seal failure, or motor wear, the calculus flips. Multiple component failures at year five suggest accelerated degradation, which means even if you fix the bearing now, another major component may fail within a year or two. This is when we recommend replacement. But if the bearing is isolated and everything else tests sound, the repair absolutely makes sense for a five-year-old machine.
