- **Jackpot:** Multiple players deposit skins into a communal pot. A winner is drawn arbitrarily, with higher-value deposits increasing a gamer's analytical chance of winning the whole pot.

Comparing CS2 Gambling vs. Traditional Online Casinos

While both involve betting, CS2 gambling differs significantly from conventional online gambling in terms of currency, availability, and community combination.
