- **Neglecting the Site's Provably Fair System:** Always use reliable websites that utilize cryptographic hashing to prove their rolls are really random. If a website feels rigged, stop playing instantly.
- **Psychological Betting:** Getting tilted after losing a battle to a lucky £ 0.05 drop turning into a knife will cloud your judgment. Take a break if you feel annoyed.
