scratched throughout significant areas. **Battle-Scarred (BS)** 0.45-- 1.00 Greatly distressed. The weapon looks rusted, heavily painted over, or seriously used down.

Rarity Tiers and Weapon Grades

CS2 skins are categorized by rarity. The color of the item's name tag in the stock shows its tier. Greater rarities are exponentially harder to pull from cases, increasing their market value.

- **Consumer Grade (White):** Common, standard drops.
- **Industrial Grade (Light Blue):** Slightly less typical base weapons.
- **Mil-Spec (Dark Blue):** Standard drop swimming pool for most weapon collections.
- **Limited (Purple):** Often includes striking artwork; used frequently in trade-up agreements.
