Techniques and Risk Management

1. Fixed-Percentage Bankroll Method

- **Action 1:** Determine a total bankroll (the amount of funds dedicated to CS: GO Crash).
- **Action 2:** Wager a set portion of that bankroll (e.g., 1%-- 2%) on each round.
- **Step 3:** After each win or loss, recalculate the stake based upon the updated bankroll.

2. Auto-Cash-Out Ladder

- **Take-Profit:** Set a target profit (e.g., 50% gain). Upon reaching it, cash out completely to avoid giving the profits back.

- **Neglecting your home Edge:** Players who focus entirely on the multiplier ignore the cumulative result of the platform's edge.
- **Ignoring Security:** Using the very same login credentials across numerous websites or keeping big balances on the platform can expose funds to theft.
- **Playing Without a Budget:** Failing to set a clear bankroll before beginning cause impulsive decisions and financial stress.
