Understanding the Wheel Segments

The 52-segment wheel is divided into numbers and benefit video games. The numbers pay out even money or better, while the perk symbols offer players entry into the game's heading acts.

Here is how the wheel is distributed:

- **Number 1:** 21 sections (Pays 1:1)
- **Number 2:** 13 sectors (Pays 2:1)
- **Number 5:** 7 sectors (Pays 5:1)
- **Number 10:** 4 segments (Pays 10:1)
- **Coin Flip:** 4 sections
- **Pachinko:** 2 sections
- **Cash Hunt:** 2 sectors
- **Crazy Time:** 1 sector

The Top Slot Feature

Before every spin of the primary wheel, a two-reel mini fruit machine situated directly above the wheel spins all at once.

- **Reel 1** screens a bet spot (either a number or a perk video game).
- **Reel 2** displays a multiplier (varying from 2x up to 50x).

If the bet area and the multiplier align horizontally, that multiplier is applied to the corresponding section on the main wheel for that round. If the wheel arrive on that segment, all wins for that bet are multiplied appropriately, setting the stage for massive payments.

Dive Into the Four Bonus Rounds

The true magic-- and volatility-- of Crazy Time depends on its four interactive bonus rounds. These games transport gamers out of the studio by means of CGI and offer the video game's most significant win capacity.

1. Coin Flip

The easiest of the reward rounds, Coin Flip features a red-and-blue token turned by a maker.

- **How it works:** Before the flip, both sides of the coin are assigned random multipliers.
- **The Outcome:** Whichever color lands face up awards the gamer the multiplier connected to that side.

2. Pachinko

Inspired by the conventional Japanese arcade video game, Pachinko features a big physical wall filled with pegs.

- **How it works:** The host drops a puck from the top of the board. It bounces randomly down through the pegs up until it lands in one of a number of multiplier slots at the bottom.
- **The "Double" Feature:** If the puck lands in a "DOUBLE" slot, all multipliers at the bottom of the board double, and the puck is dropped again for a chance at even bigger prizes.

3. Cash Hunt

Money Hunt is an interactive shooting gallery video game provided on a huge screen with 108 random multipliers hidden behind numerous symbols (like a cactus, a target, or a chef's hat).

- **How it works:** Players utilize an on-screen cannon to aim and contend a sign of their option before the countdown timer expires. When the timer ends, all players reveal the multiplier hidden behind their picked target. (Note: In automated play, the video game picks a target for the gamer).

4. Crazy Time

The supreme bonus offer round and the *bet crazy time* hardest to trigger. The host opens a red door, leading players into a surreal, brightly colored virtual world including a massive, 64-segment wheel.



- **How it works:** Players should choose among 3 flappers (Green, Blue, or Yellow). The host spins the wheel, and whichever multiplier the selected flapper points to when the wheel stops is granted to the gamer.

- **The "Double" and "Triple" segments:** Just like Pachinko, if the wheel stops on a "DOUBLE" or "TRIPLE" segment, all multipliers on the wheel increase appropriately, and the wheel is spun once again. This is where the maximum 20,000 x multiplier can be achieved.

Pros and Cons of Playing Crazy Time

Like all gambling establishment video games, Crazy Time comes with its own special set of benefits and prospective downsides.

Pros:

- **Unmatched Entertainment Value:** High-energy hosts, bright visuals, and game-show styling make it extremely fun to view and play.

- **Busy:** Rounds happen quickly, which can lead to overspending if players do not manage their bankrolls carefully.

Fundamental Strategies for Crazy Time

While Crazy Time is a video game of pure possibility dictated by a random number generator (RNG) and physical wheel physics, players frequently utilize wagering methods to manage threat and extend their playtime.

- **The Cover-All Strategy:** Betting on all or most of the segments (numbers and perk games) guarantees you rarely miss a spin, though the cost of covering the board can surpass the smaller sized payments.
- **Benefit Chasing:** Focusing solely on the bonus offer rounds (Coin Flip, Pachinko, Cash Hunt, and Crazy Time). This is a high-risk, high-reward technique because reward rounds take place on only 9 of the 52 sections.
- **Analytical Betting:** Relying on the video game's history tracker. Some gamers like to bet on sections that have not struck in a very long time (the "hot/cold" fallacy), though previous spins statistically have no bearing on future results.
