- **Coinflip:** An easy, high-stakes 1v1 game where 2 gamers wager equal quantities, and a virtual coin flip figures out the sole winner.
- **Prize:** Multiple players pool their skins into a single pot. The higher the worth of a gamer's skins, the greater their statistical possibility of winning the entire pot.
- **Esports Betting:** Wagering on expert CS2 matches (such as BLAST, ESL Pro League, and Majors) utilizing skins, crypto, or cash.
