The very first company she called priced estimate a low rate by phone for a half-truck, said they might "probably take the paint," and offered a two-hour window between noon and 4 p.m.

We brought in a team that insisted on an on-site price quote. They measured approximately two-thirds of a truck once the lumber was cut and stacked. They flagged the paint and solvents as hazmat, estimated 12 gallons overall, and offered two choices: the property owner could drop the cans at the county occasion on Saturday morning for free, or the company could manage hazmat transport for a flat 120 dollars, which covered their charge and the facility consumption. They also verified they would evacuate the freezer's refrigerant effectively and supplied the certification of their device recycler.

The difference in professionalism was clear. The property owner chose to spend for hazmat handling to conserve time, accepted the firm cost, and arranged for 9 a.m. Two team members showed up early, prepped doorframes with blankets, and had the garage clear by 10:45. They swept up sawdust, left the usable lumber aside for a next-door neighbor who asked to keep it, and provided donation receipts for the bikes after providing them to a neighborhood repair work program. The invoice matched the quote. That is the basic to seek.

The environmental math of one truck
