Move CS2 to an SSD and clear the cache. **Random Freezes mid-match** Thermal throttling or background software interference. Display temperature levels and close unnecessary apps.

Fixing Checklist: How to Fix CS2 Crashes

If CS2 is disrupting your matches, overcoming a structured troubleshooting process is the most effective method to find a fix.

1. Confirm Game File Integrity

- Open Steam and navigate to your **Library**.

3. Change In-Game Video Settings

- Disable **FidelityFX Super Resolution (FSR)** if it causes instability.
- Lower **Global Shadow Quality** and **Particle Detail**.
- Make Sure **Reflex Low Latency** is set to "Enabled + Boost" instead of triggering conflicts with your particular CPU.

4. Handle Overlays and Background Applications

Overlays are well-known for triggering hook disputes with the **Skin Crash Game** Source 2 engine. Consider disabling:

- Discord Overlay
- Steam Overlay (Right-click CS2 in Steam > > Properties > > General > Enable the Steam Overlay while in-game -> >
