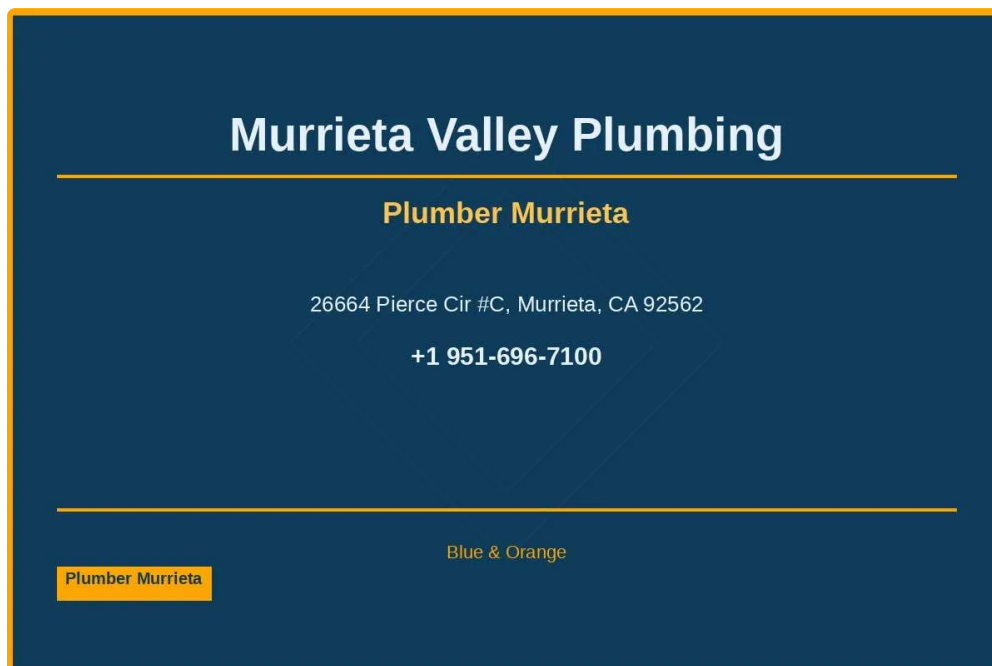


Sump Pump Installation and Repair for Murrieta Properties Sump pumps are not the first thing most Murrieta homeowners think about, but for properties with a basement, a crawlspace prone to moisture, or a yard that collects runoff during the rainy season, a working sump pump is what stands between a dry home and a flooded one. Murrieta Valley Plumbing installs and repairs sump pump systems, testing existing units to confirm the float switch, check valve, and discharge line are all functioning correctly before the winter rains arrive. A pump that has not been tested in a year or two is a real risk, since these systems tend to fail silently until the moment they are actually needed. For new installations, sizing the pump correctly to the property's drainage needs matters more than most homeowners realize. An [local plumbing near me](#) undersized pump will run constantly and burn out early, while a properly matched system handles peak flow without struggling.

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Anyone who has searched plumber near me after finding standing water near a foundation or a sump pit that will not activate should get the system checked before the next storm rolls through the valley, and Murrieta Valley Plumbing offers free estimates on both installation and repair.

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Battery backup systems are worth a mention here too, since a sump pump is only as reliable as the power supply keeping it running, and Murrieta does see occasional power outages during the heavier storms that roll through the valley. A backup system kicks in automatically if the primary pump loses power or fails outright, which is exactly the scenario where a home is most at risk of flooding, during a storm when the power has already gone out. Murrieta Valley Plumbing includes backup options as part of new sump pump installations and can retrofit one onto an existing system for homeowners who already have a pump but no failsafe behind it. Given how inexpensive a backup system is relative to the cost of water damage repair and cleanup, it is one of the more straightforward upgrades a Murrieta homeowner can make to protect a property with a basement or a flood prone yard. Annual testing before the rainy season is the simplest way to avoid an unpleasant surprise, and Murrieta Valley Plumbing can add a sump pump check to any other scheduled visit so it does not get forgotten between one winter and the next.
