- **The Martingale System:** A traditional betting technique where a gamer doubles their bet after every loss. The theory is that a single win will recover all previous losses plus a profit equivalent to the original base bet. However, this requires a massive bankroll and can rapidly strike website wagering limitations.
- **The Reverse Martingale (Paroli):** Players double their bets after a *win* instead of a loss, trying to ride a winning streak while keeping losses lessened to the base bet quantity.
- **The Moonshot Strategy:** Placing small bets with the intent of claiming huge multipliers (50x, 100x, or greater). This works just like playing the lottery game.
