- **4. Make Use Of Lower-Cost Cases for Longevity**Instead of blowing your entire budget on a single battle featuring costly cases (like Operation cases or Dreams & Nightmares), decide for more affordable cases to play more rounds. This minimizes variation and extends your gaming session.
