Step-by-Step Troubleshooting Guide

If you are experiencing repeating crashes, overcome the following troubleshooting actions systematically.

1. Validate the Integrity of Game Files

Gradually, video game files can become damaged due to unforeseen system shutdowns, insufficient updates, or defective storage drives. Steam has a built-in tool to examine and change missing or broken files.

- Open the **Steam Library**.
- Right-click on **CS: GO** and choose **Properties**.
- Browse to the **Local Files** tab.
- Click **Verify Integrity of Game Files**.
- Await the process to surface (Steam will automatically download any corrupted files), then reboot your computer system.

2. Update or Roll Back Graphics Drivers

- **NVIDIA Users:** Open GeForce Experience or visit the main NVIDIA website to download the most recent Game Ready Driver.
- **AMD Users:** Use the AMD Software: Adrenalin Edition to look for updates.
- *Pro Tip:* If the crashes began instantly after a chauffeur update, utilize a tool like **Display Driver Uninstaller (DDU)** in Safe Mode to entirely wipe the old motorist before setting up a steady, older variation.

3. Adjust Launch Options

Specific launch options can force CS: GO to run in a more stable environment, bypassing introduction videos or forcing specific DirectX modes.

- Go to your Steam Library, right-click **CS: GO**, and choose **Properties**.
- Under the **General** tab, try to find **Launch Options**.
- Go into the following suggested steady commands (separated by areas):

 - -high (Sets CS: GO to high CPU top priority)
 - -autoconfig (Resets video and performance settings to default if the game declines to launch)

4. Run the Game as Administrator

Permissions problems can often avoid CS: GO from accessing needed system files or saving setup modifications.

- Browse to your CS: GO installation folder (typically C: \ Program Files (x86)\ Steam \ steamapps \ common \ Counter-Strike Global Offensive).
- Locate the main executable file (csgo.exe).
- Right-click the file and select **Properties**.
- Go to the **Compatibility** tab and inspect **Run this program as an administrator**.
- Click Apply and OK.

5. Look For Background Application Interference

Overlay software and hardware tracking tools regularly hook into the DirectX pipeline of video games, which can trigger sudden crashes. Attempt disabling the following applications while playing:

- Discord Overlay
- NVIDIA GeForce Experience Overlay
- RivaTuner Statistics Server (RTSS) and MSI Afterburner
- Third-party anti-viruses software (try including an exemption for the Steam folder)

Advanced Troubleshooting

If standard repairs fail to deal with the issue, the issue might lie deeper within your os or hardware setup.

1. Managing Overclocks and XMP Profiles

While overclocking your CPU, GPU, or RAM offers a performance increase, CS: GO is notoriously sensitive to hardware instability.



- If you have used an aggressive overclock, try calling it back to baseline factory specs.
- If you are running high-speed RAM, test disabling your motherboard's **XMP (Extreme Memory Profile)** or **DOCP** in the BIOS to see if memory instability is triggering the crashes.

2. Reinstalling CS: GO Cleanly

In some cases, remaining custom-made maps, outdated workshop items, or greatly customized configuration files cause consistent disputes.

- Uninstall CS: GO through Steam.
- Manually browse to the setup directory site (... steamapps \ common \ Counter-Strike Global Offensive) and delete any remaining folders.
- Reinstall a fresh copy of the video game.

Preventative Maintenance Checklist

- **Keep Windows Updated:** Install the newest cumulative updates for your operating system.
