2. Energy Synergy

Throwing energy randomly squanders important resources. Reliable teams collaborate their utility to attain specific objectives:

- **Flashbangs:** Pop-flashes that detonate quickly in the opponent's field of view, rejecting them an opportunity to look away.
- **Molotovs/Incendiaries:** Used to clear tight angles (like "Newell" on Inferno or "Banana") and hold-up opponent presses.
- **Smokes:** Block sniper lanes and isolate bomb sites throughout execution.

3. Map Control and Defaulting

Rather than hurrying a website blindly at the start of every round, proficient teams establish map control (defaulting).

- Spreading out throughout the map forces the CTs to reveal their positioning.
