5. Can I get VAC banned for utilizing case battle websites?

Utilizing third-party trading and case-opening sites does not straight lead to a Valve Anti-Cheat (VAC) ban. However, Valve occasionally updates its regards to service or prohibits API keys related to automatic trading bots, which can briefly interrupt your capability to trade skins.
