Winner takes all (minus a site commission). 50/50 chances, subject to a platform rake (cost). **Jackpot** Multiple gamers contribute skins to a common swimming pool. The higher the value contributed, the higher the opportunity of winning the entire pot. Probability-based based on relative skin value.
