The Anatomy of a Finish: What Determines Value?

1. Exterior Wear (Float Value)

Every product drops with a particular "float worth" varying from **0.00 to 1.00**, which identifies its physical wear and tear. The float is divided into five official wear categories:



- **Factory New (FN):** 0.00-- 0.07 (Pristine, minimal scratches)
- **Minimal Wear (MW):** 0.07-- 0.15 (Slight acnes, normally near edges)
- **Field-Tested (FT):** 0.15-- 0.38 (Noticeable wear, scratches, or fading)
- **Well-Worn (WW):** 0.38-- 0.45 (Significant wear, paint cracking)
- **Battle-Scarred (BS):** 0.45-- 1.00 (Extremely worn, in some cases drastically modifying the texture)

Note: Some products look great even in Battle-Scarred condition, while others are prized strictly in Factory New.

2. Item Rarity Tiers

Valve categorizes weapon surfaces into color-coded tiers based on their drop rates in cases or trade-ups.

Rarity Tier Color Code Drop Rate/ Acquisition Method **Consumer Grade** White Found in weekly drops/ Base video game **Industrial Grade** Light Blue Common drops/ Low-tier case contents **Mil-Spec** Dark Blue Standard

case drops **Limited** Purple Unusual case drops **Classified** Pink Uncommon case drops **Covert** Red Really rare case drops (Top-tier standard weapons) **Exotic/ Special** Gold Extremely uncommon (Knives and Gloves)

Patterns and StatTrak™: The Elements of Prestige

Beyond float values and rarities, two major features can considerably pump up a product's worth: **Pattern Indexes** and **StatTrak™ innovation**.

Pattern Templates

Lots of surfaces utilize a procedural generation system where a texture design template moves throughout the weapon design based on a "Paint Seed" (from 1 to 1000). Depending upon the seed number, the visual look can change completely.

- **Case Hardened:** Famous for its blue and gold circulations. A pattern with a high portion of solid blue on top can command 10s of thousands of dollars.
- **Fade:** Depending on the seed, the transition from yellow to pink to purple can vary, with "100% Fade" variations fetching top dollar.

StatTrak™ Technology

Products equipped with StatTrak™ feature a small digital LCD screen connected to the weapon body that tracks the variety of validated eliminates the owner makes with it. While these products drop at the exact same rate as their non-StatTrak equivalents, they generally command a higher price tag on the Steam Community Market and third-party trading websites.

How to Acquire Them

Building a digital inventory can be approached through numerous various methods, each carrying its own risks and rewards.

1. **Opening Cases:** The adventure of the gamble. Players acquire a weapon case and a matching key to unlock a random product. While everybody imagine unboxing an unusual knife, the mathematical odds greatly favor your home.
