No two skins are entirely similar, thanks to the Float Value system. A float value is a decimal number **CSGO Casino** between **0.00 and 1.00** that figures out how used or battle-scarred a skin looks.

Use Category Drift Value Range Visual Characteristics **Factory New (FN)** 0.00-- 0.07 Beautiful, minimal to no scratches or acnes. **Minimal Wear (MW)** 0.07-- 0.15 Very small wear, generally near the edges or high-friction areas. **Field-Tested (FT)** 0.15-- 0.38 Obvious scratches, scuffs, and fading. Most typical category. **Well-Worn (WW)** 0.38-- 0.45 Significant wear, heavy scratching, and noticeable paint loss. **Battle-Scarred (BS)** 0.45-- 1.00 Seriously weathered, in some cases totally altering the weapon's look.

*Keep in mind: Some skins are "capped," implying they can not drop in Factory New condition (e.g., the AWP|Asiimov maxes out at Field-Tested).*

### StatTrak™ and Souvenirs

Players can also get unique variations of skins:

- **StatTrak™**: Features an LCD counter ingrained in the weapon that tracks the number of kills made with that specific item.
- **Souvenir**: Dropped solely throughout official Valve-sponsored esports competitions (Majors), featuring gold stickers of the teams and MVP of the round.

### The CS2 Skin Economy: Why Do They Cost A Lot?

The economy surrounding CS2 skins is heavily driven by supply and demand. Since skins are acquired mostly through random drops, opening weapon cases with secrets, or trading, unusual products command incredible prices. Some famous knives and rare-patterned rifles have actually cost hundreds of countless dollars.

A number of elements dictate the worth of a CS2 skin:

1. **Rarity Tier:** Consumer (White), Industrial (Light Blue), Mil-Spec (Dark Blue), Restricted (Purple), Classified (Pink), Covert (Red), and Exceedingly Rare (Gold/Knives and Gloves).
2. **Float and Pattern Indexes:** Certain patterns (like the "Blue Gem" Case Hardened knife or the "Low Float" Crimson Web) are exceptionally uncommon and valued by collectors.
3. **Pro Player Popularity:** If a popular esports expert uses a particular skin throughout a Major, its demand often increases.
4. **Discontinuation:** Skins from old operations or gotten rid of cases can no longer drop organically, shrinking the supply while need remains stable.

- **Enable Steam Guard:** Always use two-factor authentication (Steam Guard Mobile Authenticator) to protect your account.
- **Double-check trade URLs:** When trading with others, guarantee you are trading with the actual user and not an impersonator account with a comparable name and avatar.
