

The very first time I helped a neighbor mount a sprinkler system system, we reserved one weekend. We finished on the third, sore, sunburned, and a little humbled. The system worked, although we spent the following month dialing in head placement, taking care of tiny leakages, and discovering why water stress on paper does not always match what appears of a trench line after eight tees and a surge in grade.
