- **StatTrak™:** Items with this technology include an orange LED counter that tracks the variety of verified eliminates made with that specific weapon.
- **Keepsake Packages:** These are dropped during main Valve-sponsored esports competitions (Majors) and feature gold stickers representing the teams and MVP of the round.

The Rarity Tiers

Valve organizes CS2 skins into standardized rarity tiers, which dictate how frequently they drop in-game or emerge from weapon cases.

1. **Consumer Grade (White):** Common, standard drops.
