The relationship between Valve and third-party gambling sites has actually been adversarial for many years. In 2016, Valve released cease-and-desist letters to dozens of significant skin gambling websites, arguing that they breached the Steam Subscriber Agreement and helped with minor gambling.

In reaction, the industry adapted. Sites shifted from utilizing Steam accounts straight for automatic trading to making use of cryptocurrencies (Bitcoin, Ethereum, GBPT) [skinlords.com](https://www.skinlords.com) or peer-to-peer trading systems.
