Skins are categorized into various rarity levels, normally identified by color. The rarer the skin, the lower the drop rate, and usually, the greater the rate.

Covert	Red	Incredibly uncommon, flagship weapon styles	~ 0.64%
Exotic/ Special	Gold	Ultra-rare items like Knives and Gloves	~ 0.26%

2. Use Conditions (Float Values)

Every skin is assigned a Float Value ranging from 0.00 to 1.00, which determines its physical wear and tear. This system guarantees that no two skins look totally similar.

- **Factory New (FN):** 0.00-- 0.07 (Pristine, very little scratches)
- **Minimal Wear (MW):** 0.07-- 0.15 (Slight acnes, minor wear on edges)
- **Field-Tested (FT):** 0.15-- 0.38 (Noticeable scratches and fading)
- **Well-Worn (WW):** 0.38-- 0.45 (Significant wear, paint missing out on in key locations)
- **Battle-Scarred (BS):** 0.45-- 1.00 (Heavily deteriorated, in some cases altering the skin's look entirely)

Note: Some skins are "capped," implying they can not drop in Factory New condition, making lower float variations remarkably unusual and valuable.

The Virtual Economy: Why Are Skins So Expensive?

To an outsider, spending hundreds-- and even thousands-- of dollars on a digital knife or rifle texture sounds unreasonable. However, the CS: GO skin economy runs similar to the real-world stock exchange or art market. Several economic principles drive these costs:



Supply and Demand
