

A bathroom remodel looks simple from the outside. New tile, better lighting, updated vanity, maybe a larger shower. Then the walls come open, the drain line is not where anyone expected, the subfloor has seen one leak too many, and suddenly the project depends on judgment more than inspiration photos.

That is one reason homeowners in Cape Coral often prefer working with someone local. A bathroom is one of the smallest rooms in the house, but it asks for a surprising amount of coordination.
