- **Higher-priced cases** (e.g., Broken Fang) tend to consist of rarer skins, but their market value can be unpredictable.
- **Lower-priced cases** (e.g., Gamma 2) are popular with newbies due to the fact that the essential expense is lower, offering a greater possibility of "break-even" when selling typical skins.

- **Set a budget:** Decide in advance how much you're willing to spend. Deal with case opening as home entertainment, not an investment.

Example: A gamer purchases a Revolver Case for £ 2.50 and a key for £ 2.50. If the drop yields a "StatTrak™ R8 Revolver-- Crimson Web" (Pink), the market rate may be around £ 6.00. No. Each opening is independent; previous results do not impact future probabilities. Any "system" claiming otherwise is a myth.
