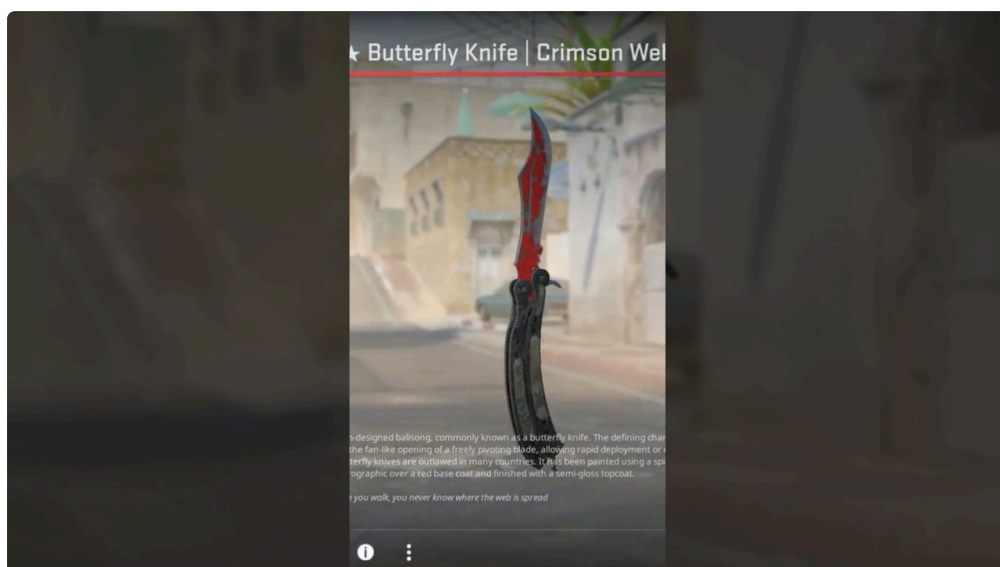


## Everything You Need to Know About CS: GO Case Keys

### How Case Keys Work

1. **Acquire a case**-- Cases can be made by playing official game modes, bought from the Steam Market, or received as drops.
2. **Get a matching secret**-- The secret must correspond to the case you plan to open.

3. **Open the case**-- In the game's main menu, choose "Inventory → Cases → Open". Insert the secret and validate.
4. **RNG result**-- The system rolls a value that maps to a rarity tier (Consumer, Industrial, Mil-Spec, Restricted, Classified, Covert, or Rare Special Item). The last skin is then included to the gamer's stock.

It's important to bear in mind that case secrets are **non-refundable** and **non-tradeable** once utilized. Unused keys can be traded or offered on the Steam Community Market, however after activation they disappear.

## Types of Case Keys

### 1. Steam Community Market (SCM)

- **Pros:** Direct integration with the game; keys are quickly provided to your inventory.
- **Cons:** Prices are set by the neighborhood and might be higher throughout high-demand periods.

### 2. Licensed Third-Party Retailers

- **Pros:** Often provide discounted rates, bulk plans, and periodic promos.
- **Cons:** You should confirm the website's authenticity; some resellers operate gray-market schemes.

### 3. In-Game Store (for select cases)

- **Pros:** Simple deal utilizing Steam Wallet funds.
- **Cons:** Limited selection; not all case secrets are offered for direct purchase.

### 4. Trade Offers

- **Pros:** Can get keys by trading undesirable skins.
- **Cons:** Requires settlement and rely on the trading partner.

## Tips for Buying and Using Case Keys

- **Match the key to the case:** Using an incorrect secret will result in an error message and waste of the secret.
- **Check market rate before getting:** Prices change; buying during a market dip can conserve money.

- **Avoid "key generators" or "free secret" scams:** No legitimate source gives keys away totally free; such offers are often phishing attempts.
- **Purchase in bulk for a discount:** Some third-party sellers minimize the per-key cost when you buy a pack of 10 or more.
- **Consider the chances:** The likelihood of getting a high-value skin is low (often less than 1%). Deal with case opening as entertainment instead of an investment.
- **Enable Steam Guard:** Protect your account from unapproved trades when buying keys from external sources.
- **Use the "Buy" function on SCM:** It ensures the deal is safe and secure and immediately credits the secret to your stock.

## Secret Pricing and Market Trends

The price of a case secret is driven by several aspects:

1. **Rarity of the case:** Older or discontinued cases often command higher crucial costs.
