- **Coinflip:** A timeless 1v1 video game where 2 players wager comparable skin worths, and a digital coin flip determines the sole winner.

- **Jackpot:** Multiple gamers discard skins into a typical pot. A virtual wheel spins, and the individual who contributed the most has the greatest statistical opportunity of winning the entire swimming pool, though luck can prefer low-tier factors.
