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Renting the wrong storage unit typically exposes itself in one of 2 unpleasant ways. You either pay month after month for empty air, or you invest moving day playing a sweaty, aggravating game of real-life Tetris, encouraged that one more lamp, one more lug, one more dining chair should somehow fit. The majority of people lean on rough guesses when selecting among storage units, and that is where problem starts.

An excellent fit is not practically square footage. It is about how your valuables act in a space. A queen mattress is uncomfortable in ways a stack of boxes is not. 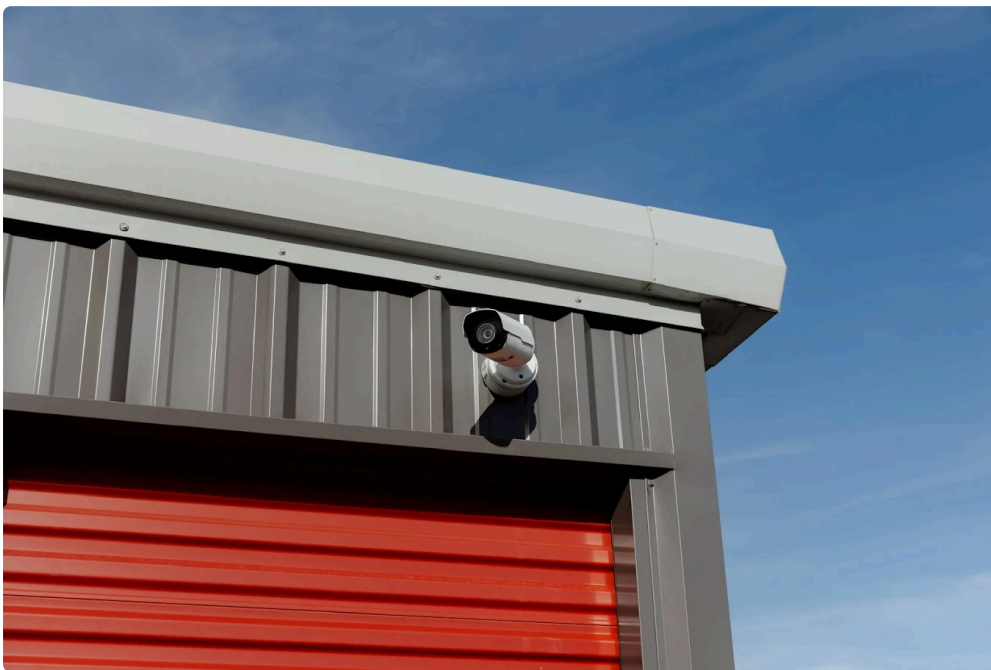

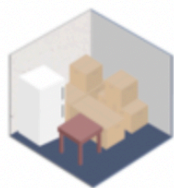
