- **The Auto-Cashout Strategy:** Players set a conservative multiplier (e.g., 1.2 x or 1.3 x) and count on consistent, incremental gains. While efficient in the short term, a single instant-crash (1.00 x) can erase numerous small wins.
- **The Martingale System:** A timeless betting strategy where a player doubles their bet after every loss, aiming to recover all previous losses plus an earnings when they lastly win. This needs a huge bankroll and frequently hits platform wagering limits.
- **The High-Risk Sniper:** Waiting for a long streak of low crashes (e.g., a number of rounds ending under 1.5 x) under the false assumption that a "high multiplier is due."

The Illusion of Control and the Gambler's Fallacy

Among the main factors Crash betting keeps such a strong grip on players is the **illusion of control**. Unlike a fruit machine where the spin is entirely automated, the player in a Crash video game need to physically click a button to cash out.

This human interaction activates psychological engagement.
