- **Low-Variance Cases:** Offer a greater frequency of cheap, stable skins. These battles tend to last longer and reduce the risk of immediate personal bankruptcy, though the ceiling for huge revenues is lower.

3. Play with Friends

Numerous platforms allow you to develop private lobbies. Playing Case Battles against good friends in a Discord call is commonly considered the most safe and most entertaining way to experience the mode, as it removes the disappointment of betting unknown bots or high-rollers.
