How Case Keys Work

3. **Open the case**-- In the game's primary menu, choose "Inventory → Cases → Open". Insert the secret and confirm.

Costs are a sign of the Steam Community Market at the time of writing and might differ.

Purchasing Keys: Where and How

1. Steam Community Market (SCM)

- **Pros:** Direct combination with the video game; secrets are instantly delivered to your inventory.
- **Cons:** Prices are set by the neighborhood and may be higher throughout high-demand periods.

2. Licensed Third-Party Retailers

- **Pros:** Often provide reduced rates, bulk plans, and occasional promos.
- **Cons:** You should validate the site's authenticity; some resellers run gray-market schemes.

3. In-Game Store (for select cases)

- **Pros:** Simple deal utilizing Steam Wallet funds.
- **Cons:** Limited selection; not all case keys are offered for direct purchase.

4. Trade Offers

- **Pros:** Can obtain keys by trading unwanted skins.
- **Cons:** Requires negotiation and trust in the trading partner.

Tips for Buying and Using Case Keys

- **Match the secret to the case:** Using an inaccurate key will lead to an error message and waste of the secret.
- **Check market value before purchasing:** Prices fluctuate; buying throughout a market dip can conserve money.
- **Prevent "crucial generators" or "free key" scams:** No genuine source offers keys away for free; such deals are typically phishing attempts.
- **Purchase in bulk for a discount:** Some third-party sellers lower the per-key cost when you buy a pack of 10 or more.
- **Think about the odds:** The probability of getting a high-value skin is low (typically less than 1%). Deal with case opening as home entertainment rather than a financial investment.
- **Enable Steam Guard:** Protect your account from unapproved trades when buying keys from external sources.
- **Utilize the "Buy" function on SCM:** It ensures the transaction is safe and instantly credits the key to your stock.

Secret Pricing and Market Trends

1. **Rarity of the case:** Older or terminated cases typically command higher key costs.
