- **Task lighting:** Often at the vanity, where precision lighting is vital.
- **Accent or mood lighting:** Optional, to elevate atmosphere.

LED mirrors naturally provide excellent task lighting and can supplement general lighting, making them highly appropriate for these compact spaces.



Task Lighting at the Vanity: LED Mirrors Versus Traditional Solutions

Standard vanity lighting in many new-build bathrooms in Birmingham and Leeds includes side or top-mounted wall lights. However, these often cast shadows across the user's face, especially if wiring or fixture placement lacks symmetry, an issue I frequently spot during snagging chats and show-home walkthroughs.
