4. Prize

Several players toss skins into a typical pot. The worth of each player's skins identifies their percentage opportunity of winning the whole pool. A virtual spinner chooses the winner, indicating a player who transferred a low-value skin still has a possibility-- albeit a little one-- to win whatever.
